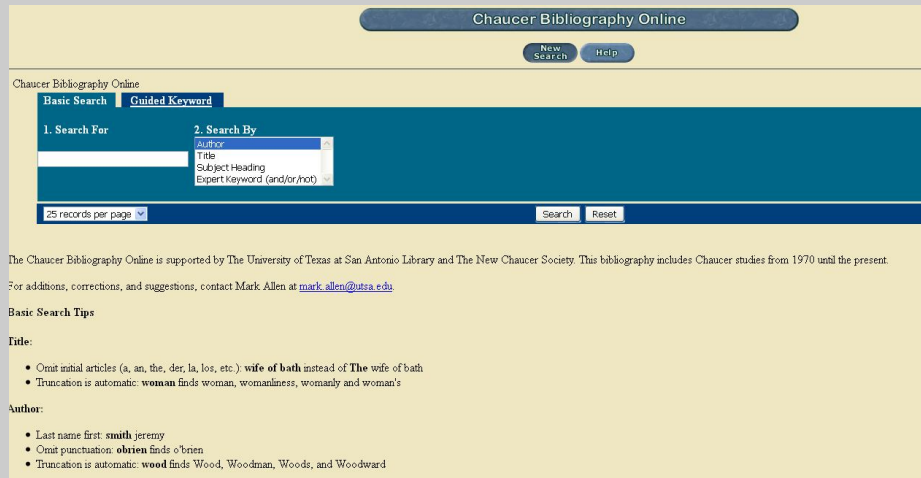

Brief History

The New Chaucer Society is a professional academic organization dedicated to the study of Geoffrey Chaucer and the Middle Ages, founded in 1979. Its predecessor, the original Chaucer Society, had been founded by Frederick James Furnivall in 1868 and had closed in 1912. It is now based at Saint Louis University in Saint Louis, Missouri. The Society also organizes a biennial international congress and supports the Chaucer Bibliography Online. The Online Chaucer Bibliography includes materials from the Annotated Chaucer Bibliography published annually in *Studies in the Age of Chaucer* and is sponsored by the NCS and the library of the University of Texas at San Antonio. It is currently maintained by Mark Allen of the University of Texas at San Antonio.

Scope and Coverage

This bibliography includes Chaucer studies from 1970 until the present.

Kind of Information

As a good bibliographic tool, each entry provides bibliographic details like title of the document, author(s), publisher detail, physical descriptions, summary or note, subjects of document. An example is given below for easy understanding.
