Brief History

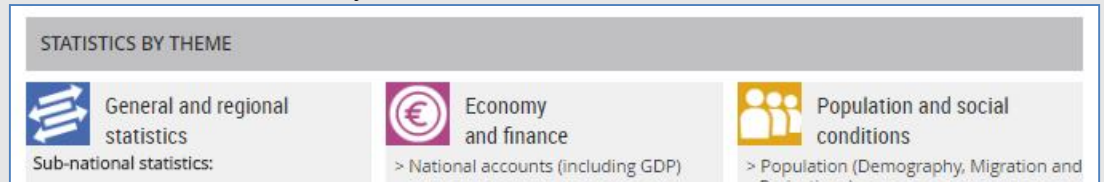
Eurostat was established in 1953 to meet the requirements of the Coal and Steel Community. Over the years its task has broadened and when the European Community was founded in 1958 it became a Directorate-General (DG) of the European Commission.

Scope and Coverage

Eurostat covers a whole range of important and interesting data that governments, businesses, the education sector, journalists and the public can use for their work and daily life. Eurostat is part of the portfolio of Marianne Thyssen, the Commissioner for Employment, Social Affairs, Skills and Labour mobility. Eurostat's key role is to supply statistics to other DGs and supply the Commission and other European Institutions with data so they can define, implement and analyse Community policies. In 1991 Eurostat's role extended as a result of the agreement on establishment of the European Economic Area and adoption of the Maastricht Treaty.

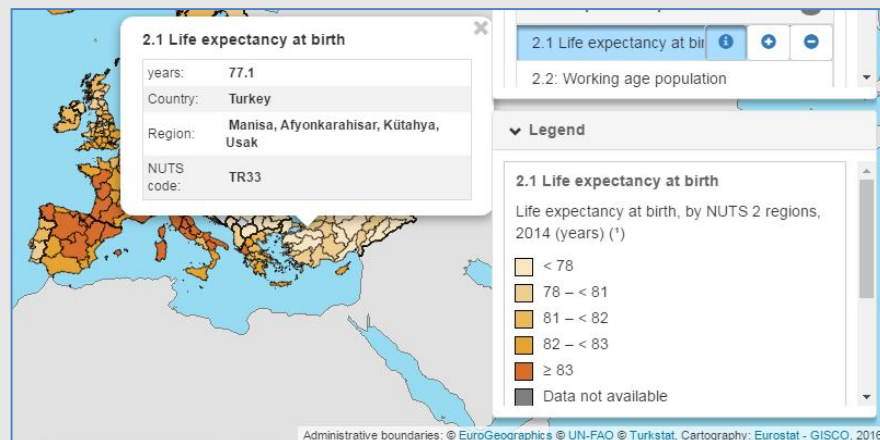
Kind of Information

Eurostat data contains many indicators (short-term, structural, theme-specific and others) on the EU-28 and the Eurozone, the Member States and their partners. Statistics can be browsed by themes as can be seen below:



It provides information on career making. It also gives information on how to access to a wide training programme in statistics and other fields like International, multicultural and diverse work environment. Visitors can know about microdata from this website including information on how microdata are provided and how to access those.

It also provides information on Geographical Information System (GIS) including maps, geodata and geospatial activities. Example is like:
